#### **DO I QUALIFY?**

## MAXIMUM REVENUE OR EMPLOYEES

According to the ADA Title III fact sheet, "A business that for the previous tax year had either revenues of \$1,000,000 or less or 30 or fewer full-time workers may take advantage of this credit."

This credit can be claimed against any effort to provide access to individuals with impairments, including expenses on website accessibility.



### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

# **COVER UP TO** \$10,250

Tax credit for web accessibility expenditures can cover 50% of the eligible access expenditures in a year up to \$10,250, with the first \$250 excluded from credit (maximum credit of \$5,000). For example, if a business spends \$7,000 on accessibility for its website, the first \$250 will not be credited. So 50% of \$6,750 would amount to \$3,375 in tax credit.
